In this role, you will guide students, nurturing their academic growth, social-emotional development, and emerging identities as community leaders and responsible citizens. As the only 3rd Grade teacher at our school, you will have the autonomy to shape the curriculum and foster a tight-knit community for your students. We are looking for an educator who believes in teaching the whole child and who brings warmth, curiosity, and intentionality to every lesson.

Here at REDS, we understand that children learn best through hands-on experiences that engage all their senses. Focusing on an active instructional technique allows students to learn through curiosity and inquiry. Student-focused, hands-on lessons are designed to engage, promote critical thinking and instill a love of learning. Frequent contact with nature and time spent in outdoor learning activities, allow our students to explore their environment with their whole selves.

Our educators strive to promote imagination in all areas. Children are encouraged to see themselves as “makers” as they grow their creative intelligence. “Out-of-the-box thinking” is encouraged throughout the curriculum to allow children to become thinkers and problem solvers.

- Demonstrate mastery of assigned content areas and maintain preparedness for all classes.
- Create a safe, inclusive, and respectful classroom environment conducive to effective learning.

#### **Student & Classroom Management**

- Establish clear classroom rules and procedures to manage student behavior with consistency and care.
- Commit to supporting students' social and emotional growth as an integral part of their education.
- Take all necessary precautions to protect students, equipment, materials, and facilities.

## **Community & Communication**

- Communicate regularly with families, including a weekly newsletter that shares class updates and educates parents on the school's educational philosophy.
- Lead parent-teacher conferences each fall and on an as-needed basis throughout the year.
- Collaborate as part of the lower school team (K-4).
- Attend and actively participate in staff meetings and retreats.
- Maintain positive, professional relationships with students, parents, colleagues, and administrators.

- Demonstrate a commitment to ongoing professional development and stay current with emerging research in educational practice.

## **Qualifications**

- Bachelor's degree in Education or a related field, Master's degree in Education or a related field preferred.
- Valid state-issued teaching license.
- Minimum of 3 years of experience teaching elementary-age students.
- Strong knowledge of instructional concepts, principles, and methodologies.
- Familiarity with academic curriculum for elementary grades.
- Demonstrated ability to develop instructional goals, design and deliver lessons, and assess student learning.
- Positive, caring attitude toward children with strong interpersonal and communication skills (oral and written).
- Effective decision-making, problem-solving, conflict resolution, and planning abilities.
- Ability to stand, walk, bend, and stoop for extended periods and occasionally supervise students outdoors in varied weather conditions.
